INFORMATION COLLECTOR: <u>One</u> student was in charge of collecting all the graphics and phrases making sure all was done on time. He or She will later work with presentation coordinator.	This collection can be done in hard or soft copy. Creating these online will make sharing and using information much easier. Make sure all files are accessible even if you are away!	
VISUAL PRESENTATION CREATOR(S): <u>Two</u> students worked on the creation of the infographic/Prezi/Powerpoint.	These students are responsible for creating the visual presentation. There are several creative ways to share your information. Try one of these online presentation tools: : Easel.ly This is an online application that allows users to create infographics to visually share information.	

	<p>Prezi Prezi is a dynamic, cloud-based presentation application and can be used like Powerpoint to share information on screen with a zoomable, virtual canvas. Video links can be easily added into the presentation. .</p>	
<p>PRESENTATION COORDINATOR: One student directed the entire presentation - “who says what” who does what” and at “what time”. This must be the one minute video clip. Time limit for presentation SIX minutes.</p> <p>Very important that each person in the group has an role in the presentation.</p>	<p>This person is in charge of coordinating all aspects of the presentation and making sure each member is sure of and comfortable with what each group member has to do.</p>	
<p>REPORT WRITER: One student collected all the pieces from all group members: BLM #7, infographic, sheets, charts and other process work. The report writer puts all paper work into a file for evaluation by the teacher. Note: The infographic may be submitted electronically. He or She will write a brief ½ page report on the entire process and each team member’s role.</p>	<p>This person is in charge of what will be handed in for evaluation at the end of this unit and a brief written report of the process.</p>
